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Dear Parents

We hope they will be able to enjoy valuable time with their families and I thanks them for their years of support in ensuring that our school continues to develop its learning opportunities both inside and outside of the classroom and supporting me in securing the very best teaching and support staff for our children. I am sure that you will join me in welcoming Fr Grant onto the governing board and I know that he is currently in the process of securing new governors who are keen to continue our governors good work and our school's excellent standing in the community.

After School Clubs

School Funding and School Improvement

The Archdiocesan School Levy (£10.00) is the main way in which the Archdiocese supports school building improvement. Thank you to all of you who have contributed to this important funding stream. Without it school development becomes extremely difficult and I am delighted to inform you that I have secured £30,000 of funding to improve our perimeter fencing as well as provide an electric gate system at the front of the school which will be shared by both school and enable us to have greater control over who is able to access our school grounds. I have also obtained a £10,000 grant to upgrade and make some additions to outdoor facilities. Our new polytunnel will have the ground levelled and an artificial grass flooring installed which will be utilised by the teachers to provide similar facilities to those which many of the children have used by way of exhibiting their work. I am also awaiting the outcome of a National Lottery bid which will see the Darby Ground converted to an all weather surface (fingers crossed).

School App

We are currently trialling a school app which is linked to our school website. You simply need to download the school jotter school mobile app from the Apple App Store or Google Play. Open the app and select our school from the drop down list and hopefully you will never miss any school information again. I must stress that this is a trial and we will seek your views in the new term in order to consider purchasing this product.
