In the so-called 'Servant Song', Isaiah More Deacons writes of the mysterious servant of the Lord God. Christians have long identified Synod 2020 him with Jesus, who was formed by God WOW - Welcome in the womb and sent into the world as To Our world 'the light of the nations'. (First Reading)

The words of the Psalmist would fit well on the lips of the Servant. He worships God with 'an open ear', and with a spirit that delights in generous service.

In the Gospel, we encounter not only Jesus as he begins his public ministry, but also John the Baptist, who witnesses to Saints of the Jesus's baptism. John hears the voice of the Father and sees the Week: Spirit descend and rest on Jesus: a revelation of the three persons of the Trinity.

Peace Sunday: The Bishops of England and Wales invite us to keep Sunday 19th January as a day of prayer for world peace, and to reflect on the theme chosen by Pope Francis: 'Peace as a journey of hope: dialogue, reconciliation and ecological conversion'.

The day has a particular 'flavour' this year because we pass so many significant anniversaries in the coming months: the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz, marked by Holocaust Memorial Day on 27 January; the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II in Europe marked by a special Bank Holiday on 8 May; then, in August, the 75th anniversaries of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the 75th anniversary of Japan's surrender – all events which continue to mark our history, events which show both the human capacity for inflicting evil and the human capacity to resist evil.
